Doctors said that Farrah had a long road of recovery ahead. Victoria asked Heidi if she could start a fundraising site for her daughter. Heidi said 'yes," and Victoria began to raise money through www.gofundme.com/help-farrah.

To date, more than 6,000 donors, from all over the world, have given more than \$150,000 and the amount is still growing! Victoria is now turning over 100-percent of the money raised to 'The Farrah Soudani Irrevocable Special Needs Trust', of which Farrah is the sole beneficiary.

"I'm so amazed and inspired by the people who gave money to help Farrah after she was critically injured, even though they don't personally know her or her mom," Albright said.
